

Key Stage 2 Assessment 2017

In May 2017 our Year 6 pupils took their national tests in reading; grammar, punctuation and spelling (SPAG); and maths. These tests (often referred to as SATs) are marked externally and the results are sent to schools to share with parents and carers. The pupils also had their writing assessed by teachers against a national framework.

From 2016, children now receive a scaled score as a result. Their raw score (the actual number of marks they get) will be translated into a scaled score. Tests are set each year to the same specification, but because questions must be different, the difficulty of tests may vary slightly each year. For this reason, raw scores are converted into scaled scores to ensure accurate comparisons of pupil performance over time.

A scaled score of 100 or more means a child is working at the expected standard – termed 'AS', while a score below 100 indicates that a child hasn't reached the government expected standard – termed 'NS'. The maximum scaled score possible is 120, and the minimum is 80.
